Secondary School in Orneta joined the European project Comenius Multilateral Scholastic Partnership with the topic, "Different cultures, different ideas, the same human rights in the voice of young people". The partners in the project are schools from Portugal, Turkey and Italy . The initiator and coordinator of the project is Mrs Danuta Kaminska, an English teacher and tutor in the Student Government Secondary School No. 1. In the project will also ensure Kiewro and Anna Catherine Wróblewska. The aim is to strengthen the European dimension in education through the promotion of international cooperation involving pupils and educational staff in different Member States. Comenius gives a chance to enter into foreign cultures, overcoming the resistance of the language, making friends with peers from abroad and explore Europe. AIM OF ACTIVITY: Debates, volunteering, activities, local government, the commemoration of the Year of Janusz Korczak-reflection on three ideas Korczak-dignity children's rights and children's citizenship, trips to the partner countries: Portugal, Turkey and Italy, and hosting partners in Poland.

Carlos Humberto de Carvalho welcomed the foreign delegation and thanked by the fact that this project "help to build a happier world, because the people who work with young children and help to develop the sensibilities and knowledge and to see the world in a more understanding way.

He stressed that in Barreiro, People are the most important value and said that children and young people deserve special attention. "We live in an unfair and difficult situation, but in Barreiro, we learned not to give up, to make proposals, and rom the little, do more." Continuing to present the Council, said, "we do not have in Barreiro castles, palaces and manor houses to show you, but we have our industrial heritage which are our 'palaces', chimneys that are the 'castles' and have our people and the rivers Tagus and Coina.

In relation to the project, Carlos Humberto de Carvalho said that "knowledge is an enrichment of cultures. All this cooperation helps to create better citizens, open horizons. So your work has added value with these collaborations."

Jorge Paulo Gonçalves, Director of the School mentioned at the beginning of the reception, the first word in Portuguese, teachers taught Polish Italians and Turks was "Camarro", explaining that it is the name given to a natural Barreiro. Regarding the project, the responsible school believes that "together we do better.
